4.	The 9 of a weapon must never be rested against any part of the 10.				
5.	. Whenever a weapon isto someone else he/she must first be shown that it is(clear). When anyone else hands a weapon to him/her he/she must insist that the same action is taken.				
6.	A weapon must be in the unloaded state prior to travelling in a vehicle or during13 moves on14				
7.	A 15 must never be allowed to fire a weapon unless he/she has been 16 and 17 in its use under supervision. A period of revision should be conducted on the weapon prior to 18 firing.				
8.	When conducting training with weapons, cadets should, at all time, carry their DP or GP rifle or LSW with the19 fitted, except when undergoing formal20 ground drill.
